Belt and Road Cataract Blindness Eradication Programme Mission Accomplished 6200+ Patients Regained Eyesight in Kampong Cham Province, Cambodia

December 17, 2019 (Cambodia): The Belt and Cataract Blindness Eradication Programme was launched in May 2018 by the Belt and Road Hong Kong Centre (the "Centre"). In the past 19 months, medical teams from the Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region and the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of China have operated continuously on board the two Mobile Eye Treatment Centres stationed in the Kampong Cham Hospital and helped more than 6,200 patients regain their eyesight.

A celebration ceremony was held today at the Kampong Cham Hospital. Officiating guests including Mr C.Y. LEUNG, Chairman of the Belt and Road Hong Kong Centre; H.E. YIM Chhaily, Deputy Prime Minister of Cambodia; H.E. MAM Bunheng, Minister of Health Cambodia and Mr. WANG Wentian, the Chinese Ambassador to Cambodia jointly announced the completion of the programme in Kampong Cham. The ceremony was witnessed by some of the patients.

Guests also included Chairman Grace CHAN of the Asian Blind Prevention Foundation, a partner of the campaign and Director LIAO Pinhu of the Health and Family Planning Commission of the Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region.

Cambodian Deputy Prime Minister H.E. YIM Chhaily said at the ceremony: "the successful completion of the cataract blindness campaign has underscored the win-win cooperation between the Cambodia and China under the "Belt and Road" strategic framework. This Project has undoubtedly enhanced the friendship between our countries, I am sure there will be many more new cooperation in the future."

Mr. CY LEUNG, Chairman of the Belt and Road Hong Kong Centre said in a speech: "the Cataract Blindness Eradication campaign lasted 19 months and was the longest eye surgery campaign conducted by Chinese medical teams outside of the Country. In terms of the case volume, with over 6,200 patients, it was also China's record for medical assistance in eye service. The Campaign clearly demonstrates the strength of "people-to-people connectivity" between two countries."

"I sincerely thank the Hong Kong Business Association of Cambodia and our partner the Asian Foundation for the Prevention of Blindness for assisting. Special thanks are due to the Guangxi



medical team for sending almost 60 medical professionals in the past months to conduct voluntary medical services in Kampong Cham. They also helped the local medical staff to build the capacity in executing cataract surgeries on their own. Two fully equipped Mobile Eye Treatment Centres donated by Mr. Hui Wing-Mau will continue to serve the needy in Cambodia." Mr Leung continued.

At the ceremony, Chinese Ambassador WANG Wentian said, "the success of the campaign not only brings new life to cataract patients in Kampong Cham, but also fully demonstrates the goodwill of the People's the two countries. The Campaign denotes the cooperation of China and Cambodia for the well-being of Cambodia people."

Director LIAO Pinhu said after the ceremony: "aiming at building up a team of local eye doctors to tackle the future needs in Kampong Cham, our medical team not only performed surgery for cataract patients, but also trained up the local medical staff on both theories and advance techniques in treating cataract. The sharing of experience greatly enhanced the insight and broaden the horizon of local doctors and other medical staff."

Between 2003 and 2013, AFPB has sponsored free cataract surgery programme for India, the Philippines, Myanmar & Laos thus restoring the vision of over 10,000 poor cataract patients.
